The Children's Center offers after school social skills intervention groups for children ranging in age from approximately 5 1- 10 years old. Groups are designed for children with autism spectrum disorders and/or social communication difficulties. Children are grouped with peers using similar social and language skills. The group curricula run for 25 weeks, typically October through April. There is a low child to staff ratio (typically 3:1) and parents are encouraged to observe the group while simultaneously participating in information gathering sessions and parent-to-parent networking. Sibling childcare is provided at a minimal cost.
