HEAD START 2012-2013 RECRUITMENT DRIVE

The mission of Head Start is to provide health, education and self-sufficiency to young children and families facing adversity, including children with disabilities. Eligibility:

- Families who have a child with a special need but, do not qualify under the federal poverty guidelines.
- Families are those whose total annual income does not exceed the federal poverty guidelines.

Priority placement is given to children with disabilities, if Head Start is deemed an appropriate placement based on the child's Individual Education Plan. Program options include full-day, half-day and home-based classes. All children enrolled receive free meals while attended Head Start classes. NATIONAL PARK SERVICE'S "ACCESS PASS"


Did you know that US Citizens with documented disabilities can get a free lifetime pass to all national parks and recreation areas? The Access Pass is available to US citizens or permanent residents of the United States that have been medically determined to have a permanent disability. It provides access to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by BLM, Reclamation, Fish and Wildlife and Forest Services. There is a one-time document processing fee of \$10.00. UNIVERSITY NEUROPSYCHIATRIC INSTITUTE- MOBILE CRISIS OUTREACH TEAM

The University Neuropsychiatric Institute Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (UNI MCOT) is a partnership with Salt Lake County and OptumHealth SLCo providing crisis services to county residents. UNI MCOT is an interdisciplinary team of licensed professionals and certified peer specials available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Services include:

- Crisis resolution services for anyone experiencing a mental health crisis and requires intervention
- Rapid response- face to face assessment and crisis intervention anywhere in Salt Lake County
- Consultation and support to individuals of any age, families and treatment providers
- Follow-up services including information and referrals, linkage with appropriate community based mental health services for on-going treatment


