I would like to highlight Lendy Marcus-Penton as our volunteer of the month. Lendy is a busy mom with 7 children ranging in ages from 11 years old to 29 years old. Her children have a variety of disabilities including autism, adhd, ocd and anxiety. Lendy has been volunteering for the Utah Parent Center for many years and enjoys serving in all capacities. Participating in parent panels gives Lendy the opportunity to share her story and provide insights about her children's educational experience to future educators. Lendy expresses, "It's an honor to speak publicly, especially with students going into special education as well as general education. Sharing my story with them enables me to speak from the heart about my own experiences in regards to inclusion." Lendy supports other parents who have children with disabilities by always being available to listen, suggesting resources, and referring many of them to the Utah Parent Center. As an IEP Coach, Lendy has attended many workshops offered by the UPC and is skilled at helping

parents advocate for the educational needs of their children. She also enjoys volunteering in other capacities such as helping with conferences and events. One of Lendy's current projects is preparing a bullying awareness event with Murray School District. Lendy states, "I'm thrilled about this event and I know without the many classes I've attended through the UPC I wouldn't even attempt such a project." The next Bullying Prevention Event will be held on October 2, 2012. Lendy's passion for her volunteer work comes from her desire to give back to society and her community. It is important to Lendy to help others see things they normally might miss. Lendy's goal is to help parents and families to not only endure life but to live and enjoy life by empowering them with the knowledge and tools they need to be successful advocates for their children.

CELEBRATING 35 YEARS OF IDEA!

Prior to 1975 individuals with disabilities were excluded from education in our schools. Many individuals with significant disabilities were placed in state institutions to live out their lives in a segregated setting. In 1975 congress enacted the Education for All Handicapped Children Act. This act articulated a compelling national mission to provide a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) for all children with disabilities in the least restrictive environment. For the first time children with disabilities attended school with their typical peers. The enormous capabilities of individuals with disabilities were finally discovered. Over time the laws were enhanced and in 1990 the name of the law changed to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Please take a moment to reflect on how far we've come! I just read a book I have in my library: Late, Lost, and Unprepared A Parent's Guide to Helping Children with Executive Functioning by Joyce Cooper-Kahn, Ph.D. and Laurie Dietzel, Ph.D., 2008 Woodbine House, USA The chapters were short but full of practical and hands-on information that parents (and teachers) can use in helping children who have difficulty with executive functioning skills. The messy backpack and locker, the finished but not returned homework, tardiness, inability to plan and initiate tasks are just a few of the symptoms of executive functioning deficits. I would highly recommend this book for anyone who is looking for a better understanding of the child/adolescent with executive functioning deficits. AUTISM AND CANINE INTERVENTION RESEARCH STUDY FINDINGS



A new research study has been completed on autism and canine intervention entitled, "The Impact of Canine Assistance for Children with Autism and the Family Unit." The researcher/author, Diana L. Wild, Ph.D., who lives in Midway, Utah, shared her findings with the Utah Parent Center.

Children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) have difficulty with attention, impulsiveness, and safety issues; consequently, specific measures must be taken to ensure their safety. One such measure is canine intervention, which provides children with highly trained service dogs that can respond to their autism behaviors. The purpose of this mixed-methods study

was to determine whether a service dog, trained for children with autism, could (a) increase safety, (b) increase social reciprocity, (c) increase adaptive behaviors, and (d) reduce parental stress. Quantitative data were collected via pretest and posttest scores on two standardized assessment tests. Results revealed that the intervention group's pre–post gains were significantly more in 'social reciprocity'. Qualitative data found the child's "lack of fear of danger," which resulted in bolting and other unsafe outcomes, was the foremost concern of all parents. However, once the child was tethered to the service dog, the problem was resolved.

STOP BULLYING VIDEO CHALLENGE

On behalf of HRSA and the Federal Partners in Bullying Prevention, we encourage the youth in your life to submit original public service announcements or PSAs—videos 30 to 60 seconds in length, that showcase ways they are taking action against bullying and promoting a culture of kindness and respect in their communities.

As U.S. Health and Human Services Director Kathleen Sebelius said recently, "Bullying is a serious national challenge requiring a true national response." Please note that our deadline for submissions is October 14, 2012, at 11 PM ET. Youth between 13 and 18 years old are eligible to participate, however those under 18 years of age must have permission from a parent or guardian. The contest winner will receive a grand prize of \$2,000, with the two runner-ups earning \$500 each.

Children with Neurologic Disorders at High Risk of Death from Flu

Health care and advocacy groups join to protect children most vulnerable to influenza

PRESS RELEASE: AUGUST 29, 2012 US DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

A disproportionately high number of children with neurologic disorders died from influenza-related complications during the 2009 H1N1 pandemic, according to a study by scientists with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The report in the journal Pediatrics underscores the importance of influenza vaccination to protect children with neurologic disorders. CDC is joining with the American Academy of Pediatrics, Families Fighting Flu and Family Voices to spread the message about the importance of influenza vaccination and treatment in these children.

CDC recommends that everyone aged 6 months and older get an annual influenza vaccination, including people who are at high risk of developing serious complications. Flu vaccine is the best prevention method available. Antiviral drugs, which can treat flu illness, are a second line of defense against flu.
