FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDER RESOURCES

What are fetal alcohol spectrum disorders?

Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASDs) is the name given to a group of conditions that a person can have if that person's mother drank alcohol while she was pregnant. These conditions can include physical and intellectual disabilities, as well as problems with behavior and learning. Often, a person has a mix of these problems. FASD's are a leading known cause of birth defects.

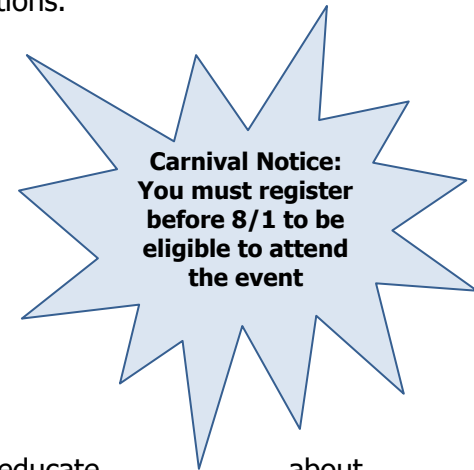
