Utah State Office of Rehabilitation: Transition

My name is Rachel Anderson. I am the Transition Specialist for the Vocational Rehabilitation program with the Utah State Office of Rehabilitation. Our mission is to assist eligible individuals with disabilities to prepare for and obtain employment and increase their independence.

The Utah State Office of Rehabilitation provides Transition Services to eligible students with disabilities as they transition from school to adult life. Our goal is to provide students with a smooth transition, holistic team approach, and services that are necessary and reasonable to help prepare for, obtain, and maintain employment. These services may include:

- VR Counseling and Guidance
- Medical/Psychological Restoration
- IEP and 504 Planning
- Job Development and Placement
- Supported Employment
- Work Adjustment and Life Skills Training
- Employer Supports and Accommodations
- Assistive Technology
- Training and Education

Our goal, as Vocational Rehabilitation Transition Counselors, is to provide the most appropriate counseling and guidance for your successful transition from high school to adulthood, independence, and employment.

Children's Mental Health Focus Group

The U.S. Department of Justice will be holding a focus group to gather information on how the children's mental health system works in Utah. They will be speaking with a broad range of stakeholders in an effort to fully understand the Utah system of care for youth with mental health needs.

The Utah Parent Center will be hosting a focus group for Youth and Families who are interested in speaking with the DOJ regarding their experiences with the children's mental health system in Utah. The DOJ has an open investigation into Utah's compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act in its children's mental health system.
