VSA ARTS & KINDRED SPIRITS 2011 SPRING SESSION

"I'm Right Here" Collage Poetry and the Art of the Senses. "I'm right here" has multiple meanings. As parents, we say this to our children when they are scared and need to know they are not alone. It is also a validation meaning "I have purpose. I matter." Prehistoric humans declared their presence with handprints on cave walls indicating "I was here." Or "I existed." This simple sentence can refer to different cultural experiences, time and, of course, it relates to all stages of physical, emotional, cognitive and social development. Session participants will explore the relationship between poetry and illustration through the playful and captivating medium of collage inspired by Javaka's lively and inventive images that engage the senses. Concepts explored are shape placement, layering for depth, special design, color and texture. Poetry will be considered both literally and visually. The children's collection of collages will be bound into one-of-a-kind books. Choose either Thursday OR Friday classes from 4:30-6:00 p.m. Classes will begin the first week of May. Max Enrollment: 10 (20 with adult partners) for each class. Children are usually accompanied by an adult partner, often a parent. The fee for this eight-week session is \$100 and includes all materials as well as the final event where all participants are honored for their work.
