Workshop/Class Descriptions

September 12, 2019	Caregiver Support/Stress Relief Taking care of someone with extraordinary needs can be very difficult. In this workshop we will talk about the needs and the ways to care for the person with a disability, or special health care need, as well as your own needs. More importantly, learn and practice some techniques to help you take care of yourself and reduce the stress! This interactive session will benefit all participants.	
October 10, 2019	IEP and 504 Plans Both Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and Section 504 plans can offer formal help for K–12 students who qualify for services. Learn the difference between an IEP and a 504 plan and what makes a child eligible. Come and learn what your rights are, and what your role is when working with the school team. Also learn about the process to follow if you disagree with the school team. Participants will leave with an understanding of each plan and how it is helpful in assisting students with a variety of learning challenges.

January 16, 2020	Early Diagnosis/Early Intervention Early intervention is the process of anticipating, identifying and responding to concerns about a child's development to minimize potential adverse effects and maximize healthy development. While all infants and toddlers learn at their own pace, some may need extra help to develop certain skills. This workshop will discuss the benefits and process of early diagnosis and early intervention.	
February 13, 2020	Maturation Puberty can be a stressful time, especially for you and your child with an intellectual and/or developmental disability which can also include Autism. In spite of delays in other areas, your child with a disability usually enters puberty around the same time as other children their age. Some children with ID or DD may start puberty early. This workshop gives you resources and tips on how to talk to your child about these sensitive topics at their level of understanding. ADULTS ONLY	
March 12, 2020	*What is DSPD?* *How can I apply?* *What can I do while on the waiting list?* *What do I do if I have a problem?* Come and learn the answer to these questions and many more at our DSPD 101 Workshop.	
April 16, 2020	Executive Functioning/ADHD Children of all ages, especially children with ADHD, Autism or Learning Disabilities, often struggle with academic performance. Organizing school work, keeping track of assignments and just keeping up with the daily grind of school work can be very challenging and daunting. This discussion will help parents better understand what Executive Functioning is, how it may impact their child in school and learn ways to address these issues. This session will help parents with any child learn effective strategies they can implement to help their child succeed in school.	
May 14, 2020	Autism 101 Autism is a complex developmental disability that typically appears during the first three years of life & is the result of a neurological disorder that affects the normal functioning of the brain, impacting development in the areas of social interaction, communication skills, and behavior. Join us for this class to learn more about Autism.
