Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) helps students with disabilities move from high school to adulthood and employment.

We help students with disabilities get ready for, find, and keep jobs. We provide activities and services customized to their needs.

Student Transition Services

It's up to you and your team to start the process.

VR is here to help when you are ready!

Where do students start?

ATTEND an orientation online or through a local VR office. Watch the Student Transition Services video to learn more.

APPLY by completing an application and scheduling an appointment for an initial interview to determine eligibility.

BECOME ELIGIBLE for VR services. If eligible, talk to your VR counselor about your goals and needed supports.

EXPLORE careers to match strengths, abilities and interests.

PARTICIPATE in Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS). Scan the QR code and select Pre-Employment Transition Services.

STAY CONNECTED with your VR counselor. Your VR counselor is your advocate to help you reach your goals!

When should I start the VR process?

You can apply for VR services starting at age 14. VR can provide you with support during high school and as you transition to employment. It's a good idea to apply early to start the process before you approach graduation.



Students, do you want skills for high-wage and in-demand careers?

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

prepares students for a successful career by offering Career Pathways that lead to college credits and industry certifications.

CTE Career Pathways

show a direct connection between doing well in high school and being able to transition smoothly to higher education and/or obtaining a highwage and in-demand career.

Scan to explore CTE Career Pathways

Talk to your school counselor about the CTE courses offered at your school.

Students enrolled in CTE:

RECEIVE academic skills along with technical skills and handson experience within 34 Career Pathways.

PARTICIPATE in training through internship and apprenticeship opportunities.

SAVE TIME AND MONEY by earning college credit towards higher education.

PREPARE for a successful career after high school and/or higher education (technical school, two-year college, or four-year college.)

MAY JOIN a Career and Technical Student Organization (CTSO).

Utah CTE Career Pathways are organized into 13 Career Clusters and each Career Pathway culminates in an industry-recognized credential of value.

CTE CAREER CLUSTERS EXAMPLES	SAMPLE OCCUPATIONS
Arts, Audio/Visual Technology & Communications	audio or broadcast technician, graphic or web designer
Business, Finance & Marketing	desktop publisher, web developer
Health Science	certified nurse assist. (CNA), emergency medical technical (EMT)
Manufacturing	machine tool technician, welder
Transportation, Distribution & Logistics	automotive or diesel technician
